### Describe method(s) for identifying barriers

Our district has a growing population of families that have limited English Proficiency. Our EL population grew 7 families just last school year, and we identified a challenge with communication with students and families. So, providing Bi-lingual interpretation during the annual evaluation. Parent/guardians are also provided materials in hard copy and in their native language.

We also have a high percent of families who are economically disadvantaged. Many without vehicles, so we offer a virtual meeting to overcome the barriers. This barrier was identified from percentanges attended at open house and parent teacher conferences. We send hard copies home with students so they are able to have access.

#### Describe method(s) for identifying needs

Parent surveys are sent out annually. They are sent in both a hard copy for home and an electronic survey to meet the varying needs of families. Parents are communicated with regularly through text cast, emails, newsletters, conferences, and phone calls. Regular achievement reports are sent home as well.
